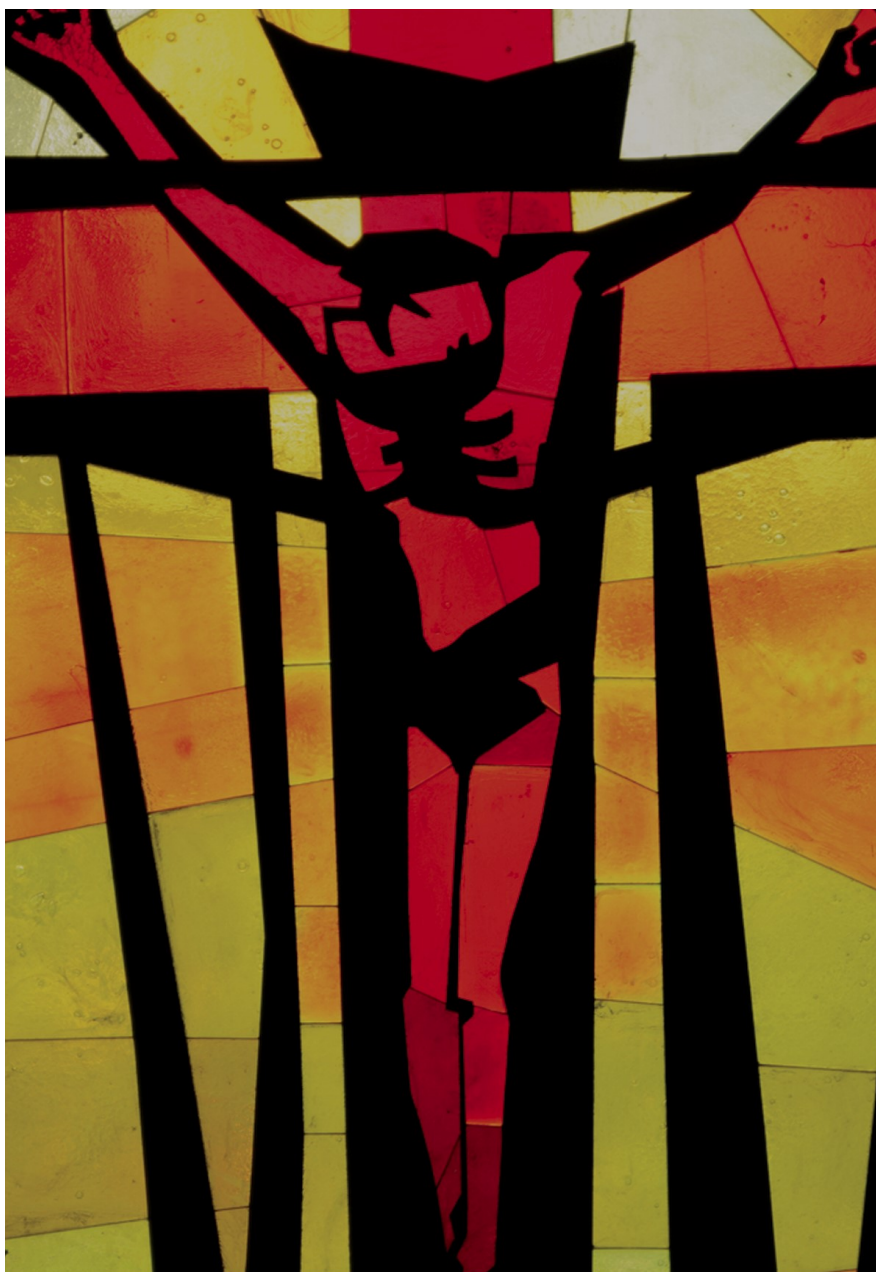

Our worship tonight takes the form of a Tenebrae service. The word “Tenebrae” comes from the Latin meaning “shadows” or “darkness” so it is a service of shadows.

The Tenebrae makes use of gradually diminishing light through both the lowering of the lights in the sanctuary and the extinguishing of candles, to symbolize the events of Holy Week from the Last Supper through Jesus’ death on the cross.

The service concludes in a darkened sanctuary, with the final candle, the Christ candle, being extinguished, representing the death of Jesus.

You are encouraged to leave in silence as you ponder the impact of Christ’s death.

You are invited to attend the Community Easter Sunrise Service that is sponsored by the Downtown Churches, 7:00 am at Manly Memorial Baptist Church.

The Rev. McKinley Williams of First Baptist Church will be the speaker this year. Breakfast will follow the service. Then our Easter worship will begin at 11:00 am.
